

- St. Thomas Aquinas Academy's enrollment grew by 9% this year despite the economic downturn.
- Expenses have been reduced by almost \$200,000 by closing the Holy Family campus and sharing of personnel.
- Catholic Central High School is the only Catholic high school north of Green Bay and there are no Catholic high schools in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.
- The Catholic Central High School Foundation, operated independently from the academy, uses investment earnings to help the Academy.
- STAA has opportunities in The Angel Donor Program that sponsors tuition for individual students or specific families in the elementary, middle, and high school.

Supporters and benefactors of the Academy have a right to be proud of its academic achievements and, most importantly, of its community of young Catholic learners.

The 2009/2010 school year is a crucial one for the Academy.

To continue program expansion for our students and grow our enrollment, the Academy must raise sufficient funds in the 2009/2010 Annual Giving Campaign to retire a portion of our existing debt and to be ready to meet an anticipated budgetary shortfall.

The goal for this Campaign is \$300,000.

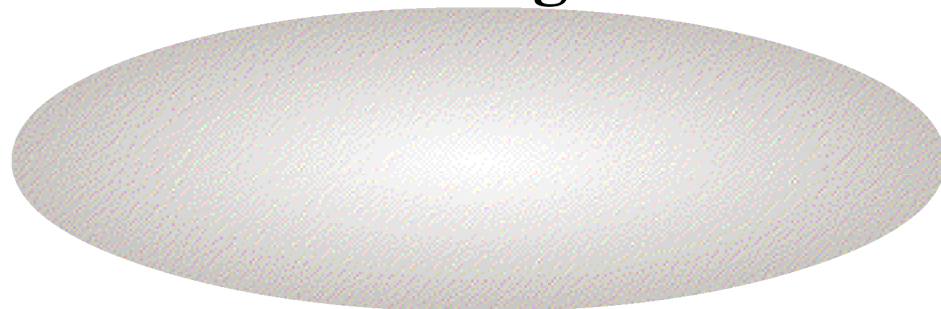

21st century education demands that each student learn to the best of their own ability. Many students struggle with ADD/ADHD, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Learning Disabilities, Cognitive Delays, or may be under challenged Gifted and Talented learners. Whatever the challenge is, the Resource Room at St. Thomas Aquinas Academy strives to provide for the specific needs of individual learners. Here, we recognize each child as an individual gift from God whose talents and abilities are different from their peers. In the Resource Room, our focus is to help the individual learn using the modality that works best for them.

Our Supportive Consultants provide students the support they need to succeed. Students who need visual supports may be provided visual prompts that enable them to complete their work without further teacher intervention. Those struggling with attention challenges might use sensory aides that enable the brain to focus differently. Students on the Autism Spectrum have the opportunity to learn strategies for coping with anxiety or stress, as well as get needed assistance with social and communication difficulties. Gifted and Talented students can learn to cope with their

own social and emotional challenges as well as meet their need to progress at a rate that is uniquely theirs. Those who require help communicating their knowledge can use assistive technology designed specifically for them. Organizational skills are also addressed through the Resource Room.

This year, I am teaching individualized math and reading as well. Students in my math class are learning using an online program designed by the National Science Foundation. The program, set to state standards, allows students to master skills, learning at their own pace. My reading class is part of Wilson phonics and teaches reading and spelling within a concentrated word study program.

The Supportive Consultant program has only been in place for one year and already some of our students who have struggled in other educational environments have found success and self-confidence at St. Thomas. Through our school year program, as well as our summer school, we have helped students reduce the need for medications and advance their academic achievement. It is my hope that we can continue to provide for those already here as well as expand our program to meet the needs of more students in our community.

Having graduated from St. Norbert College 26 years ago, I have worked in education my entire career. I have extensive training in Autism, Gifted and Talented, Reading, and Sensory Integration. My work with students at the Academy is some of the most rewarding and uplifting work I have done. Every day I have the opportunity to see the light of learning open up a new world to my students. To be able to help a child work through their disability and develop the confidence to allow their real gifts to shine through is truly a blessing.
